### **Program Description:**

The program has three components: 1. Faculty training workshop in Technology infusion and new pedagogical methods. 2. A course on Experiment Design with industrial applications, using Taguchi methodology. 3. Help in establishing criteria to design a Quality and Reliability Center at the university, which presently does not exist in the country. EPN faculty have an incipient plan, and it is hoped that the center would provide two important services, once established: low-cost access for the service and industrial sectors of the country, and hands-on experience for students, who, once in contact with the mentioned sectors, would have immediate access to jobs in this specialization.

### **Program Purpose:**

The program seeks to main objectives, one short term, and a second long-term. The faculty development workshop and course seek to enhance and train faculty in the most advanced teaching techniques, including projects, technology in education in groups, use of internet and specialized software, all directed to create a student-centered teaching approach, using techniques such as group learning, team projects and contextual work. Students will benefit not only in what they learn but in other important techniques, such as group communications, team work, self-motivation, acceptance and delivery of critique, and others. For the long-term, and through the creation of an academic-industrial center, the program seeks to bring together theory and practice for both faculty and

students, seeking as the ultimate goal a better prepared professional productive force for the country.
